

THE 16TH ANNUAL ROBERT CLASSIC FRENCH FILM FESTIVAL — sponsored by Jane M. & Bruce P. Robert Charitable Foundation and presented by the Saint Louis Art Museum — celebrates St. Louis' Gallic heritage and France's cinematic legacy.

The theme for this year's festival is The French Family. Our goal is to explore the meaning of family throughout the history of French cinema.

The festival kicks off with the award-winning documentary April In France, which had its world premiere at last year's St. Louis International Film Festival (SLIFF). Filmmaker David Boaretto will attend and co-host an Opening Night Reception on Friday, April 12th at 6:30 pm.

Boaretto will also present a film of his choice, the classic Truffaut film The 400 Blows.

This year's classic is Jean Cocteau's 1948 film The Storm Within (Les Parents Terribles). Cocteau is considered one of the great French poets, playwrights, novelists and visual artists of the 20th century and he considered this his greatest film.

Every program features introductions and discussions by film or French scholars and critics. All films are in French with English subtitles.



Jean Cocteau films an adaptation of his successful stage play, The Terrible Parents. Young Michel (Jean Marais) is in love with the attractive Madeleine (Josette Day), so he decides to tell his parents of his intention to marry her. He thinks his announcement is innocent enough; his engagement, however, threatens to reveal dark secrets lurking within his family's home. Yvonne (Yvonne de Bray), Michel's overbearing mother, concocts an elaborate scheme to drive Madeleine away, thus keeping uncomfortable household truths from being exposed.

In 2020, her film Esseghayra (Miss) was selected in the Berlin International Film Festival and got the Special Mention the Jury, Category: Generation/ Children's Jury award, and was a double winner at the Mediterranean Film Festival in Rome in Best Short Film and UNIMED Prize for Intercultural Dialogue.
